Advice on the Wisdom Project

Some Additional thoughts to those initiating a Wisdom Project:

- It's essential to get a core team of 3 or 4 people who are really enthused and willing to set the pace. These will be like "starter yeast."
- At first most people won't really know what this is about. You might want to talk with people, about several things:
 - 1. How they really have some valuable wisdom to pass down.
 - What valuable advice do they consider really insightful.
 - You can have them start with great quotes they think reflect deep understanding. Then they can contribute their own insights
 - Another way to start is to have them tell interesting stories.
 - If people don't like to write, you can have them dictate these stories. Newer versions of Word have a speech to text mode. Dragon makes good software. Another option is to tell the story into a digital tape recorder and send the story to India, where transcribers will put the story into written words very easily.
 - 2. What is important about linking the older generation to the unborn new generations.
 - *The purpose of culture is to transmit the best of one generation to the next generation*
 - How would senior residents like to be remembered? A eulogy is just not enough.

Things like *Guiding Principles* are a great way to communicate who you are in your soul. (see *Be the Champion of Your Life* – by Robert Porter Lynch – last chapter)

- 3. Make it fun, spirited, and exciting.
 - Stories are a good way to get started.
 - Don't be afraid to talk about failures and what you learned.
 - Some of the most humorous stories are about doing something dumb.
 - Don't be modest about achievements, but find a way to make sure it's not an ego story about me, myself, and I.
- 4. Be organized
 - Decide what the work schedule is and try to keep on target
 - Divide into work teams of 2-5 people (think about how micro-economic teams work to help each other)
 - Create a culture of teamwork, mutual assistance, and sharing of information
- 5. Be alert and ready when an Idea appears

- Ideas for content in the book can emerge at any moment
- Keep a small notebook or post-it notes handy so when an idea pops into your head you can write it down.
- 6. Don't worry if you are not an adept writer
 - Other members of the team can help edit your ideas
