3. Be Trustworthy:

- <u>Be Truthful</u>: Keep your word & promises.
- Be Honorable: Never use Public Office for Personal Gain. Do not lie, deceive, cheat or steal.
- Be Courageous: Stand for what's right. Stand against what's wrong. Do not act with malicious intent.
- Be Vigilant: Keep a keen eye on those who are cruel, evil, manipulative or cunning.

4. Be Fair:

- <u>Be Just</u>: Listen to all sides before making judgments. Do not intentionally polarize.
- Be Creative: Turn differences into opportunities to learn, be agile, innovate and unite.
- Be a Guardian: Protect others. Do not deprive others of safety, security, or family.
